
Sonja offered a tour of her studio where she crafts the most excellent weavings. The grounds are well designed and artistic touches are abundant.














Olga and Hank became friends before long.








Dal Nietzel posed with me. A picture of Illinois Ghost. We made good friends with Roamin' Buffalo from Colorado.








We also made good friends with Richard and Nancy from Montana. Pat talked a good bit with Cathy from Alaska.










We turned north on Hwy 4 which is west of Santa Fe. Some of the mountains and cliffs were highly figured. We stopped at Soda Hot Springs Dam.
